Act 32 of 2022 required OMHSAS to amend the Chapter 5100 regulations specific to confidentiality to add "covered entity's business partner" as a party that can see protected information.

Next steps:

- 1. OMHSAS has drafted a bulletin to ensure entities that they may share confidential health information with a business partner.
- 2. OMHSAS has drafted revised Chapter 5100 regulations to align confidentiality requirements in the Mental Health Procedures Act with those in HIPAA. This change will support collaborative care models.

Policy Updates - Crisis Call Center Bulletin



- The draft 1993 unpromulgated crisis regulations required counties to operate 24/7 crisis lines. OMHSAS uses those regulations as a statement of policy to license programs.
- The Crisis Call Center Bulletin OMHSAS-23-02, "Emergency Services: 24/7 Call Centers," removed the requirement that counties operate their own crisis lines.
- Counties will be expected to load county-specific crisis resources into a webbased resource directory that 988 call takers at all 14 PA call centers will utilize.

Expanding Mental Health Supports

This budget prioritizes a robust mental health support system to assist with the complex and varying needs of all Pennsylvanians.

- \$100 million for the School-Based Mental Health Supports Block Grant for resources for school students and staff
- **\$20 million** in increased funding for county mental health services
- \$4 million to expand community-based diversion programs
- Dedicated, sustainable, funding for 988 telephone support and \$5 million for one-time system buildout
- Increased mental health supports for farmers and ranchers
